ENTRIES and CLOSING DATES

Entries must be received (not just postmarked) by 6 PM Wednesday, June 30. Entries will be accepted by Federal Express or Express Mail only if the Signature Waiver is signed. No fax, email, or telephone entries will be accepted. There is no limit to the number of dogs that can participate in this agility trial.

You may request a change in or cancel your entry by e-mail to JAGTrialSec@gmail.com at any time prior to the closing date. **There is no secondary closing date for this trial.** No change in jump height or program will be accepted after the closing date. For refundable changes, please see Notice to Competitors for details.

CHECK-IN AND MEASURING

Check in shall be from 7:15 am to 7:45 am on Friday. All times are tentative and subject to change. Consult your entry confirmation for schedule changes. There are separate check-ins for JAG and High Octane, but if you are entered in both trials you may also check-in on Friday for the High Octane Agility trial. There will be no Thursday night check-in.

CHECK IN: All competitors must check-in at the check-in table during the morning check-in time. Competitors that included a copy of their yellow (NOT BLUE) permanent height card with their entry form may use Express Check-in and are then exempt from measuring in. At Express Check-in you must check yourself in and verify your registration number. If you missed verifying it in your confirmation, this will be your final chance to do so. Please note that there is separate check-in for JAGI and High Octane Agility. Dogs and handlers who have checked in once for the weekend do not need to check in again on subsequent days.

MEASURING IN: During the morning check-in time, all dogs must be measured prior to being checked in unless the dog jumping 26" (22" Performance), the handler presents a permanent yellow height card, a blue, temporary card with 3 measurements awaiting CMJ or an authorized check-in letter from USDAA / print out of dog info page from subscriber account indicating the dog is permanently carded.

Change of jump heights will be made ONLY when the dog is required to move into a higher category by the judge's measure-in. The handler can decide to run For Exhibition Only at the lower jump height; however, no awards or qualifying scores may be earned and no change in program is allowed.

The handler of a dog entered in Team/PVP that measures up must notify the secretary at check-in. The secretary shall make every attempt to form complete teams/pairs from the dogs available. The dog measured up must jump at the higher jump height in order for the team/pair to earn a qualification. If the dog runs FEO at the lower jump height, the team/pair may not qualify, but the partners may earn placements and top ten points in the individual classes.

Following are the jump heights for the Championship Program (Performance Program heights in parentheses):

DIRECTIONS TO SHOW SITE

From 322 headed West:

Take 322 through Mullica Hill, Turn left on 322 at Harrison House Diner, Continue approx. 6 miles toward Com Barry Bridge. Take exit for US-130 South, **Pass under gray lift bridge and look for park entrance 1/4 mile on the right at High Hill Road intersection.

From Philadelphia

Follow I-95 to the Commodore Barry Bridge Exit. Cross the bridge and stay to your right. Take the first exit ramp for Route 130 South, (Penns Grove). See above **

From the South:

295 North over Del. Memorial Bridge. Continue on 295 North toward Trenton for 11 miles. Take Exit 10, Center Square Road Turn left and go approx. 1.5 miles Turn right on 130 North approx. 1 mile. Look for park entrance on the left at the High Hill Road intersection

From the North

295 South toward the Del. Memorial Bridge. Take right fork onto US-130 South toward Bridgeport/Com Barry Bridge. Go 2.1 miles. Continue on 130S. See above **

NOTICE TO COMPETITORS

Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of current USDAA Rules and Regulations, including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry, and will comply. USDAA's official Rules and Regulations are hereby incorporated by reference, a copy of which may be viewed online at www.usdaa.com. Subscribers to the USDAA site may download a printable copy.

This test is open to all dogs being at least eighteen months of age, including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness that may affect the dog's ability to perform safely, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.

All dogs must be registered with USDAA in order to compete in USDAA sanctioned events. Register your dog online at www.usdaa.com, General Information, Dog registration, for a reduced fee. Receive the registration number immediately and the height card prior to the show. Or registration may be made concurrently with entry to this show, a form for which is included in this Agility Test Schedule.

Competitors (handler or their dog) may not enter any class held for title under a judge who resides in the same household or with whom they have trained in the past ten (10) days.

No leads, collars, food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.

Safety shall be of foremost consideration at all times. Handlers, through entry at this event, accept full responsibility for themselves, their guests and the actions of their dogs. Any incidents of dog aggression resulting in harm to other dogs, handlers, or the general public that occur within the show grounds will be reported by the Show Committee to the appropriate authorities for investigation and possible further action.

The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee view that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee. No entries shall be accepted, changed, altered or withdrawn after the closing date, except for changes in the level for dogs already entered.

No entries shall be accepted, changed, altered, or withdrawn for any reason after the closing date, except that an entrant may move up in class level as provided in the section titled "Entries and Closing Dates" herein.

FAULT LIMITS MAY BE APPLIED in all classes for which faults are assessed. Limits shall be announced during the judges' briefings.

REFUNDS: There shall be no refunds for entries withdrawn after the closing date or in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of reason for such dismissal. After closing, but prior to commencement of the trial, entry fees, minus a \$5 administrative charge, judges' and USDAA's fees, will be refunded for injured or sick dogs, injured or sick handlers, and bitches in season, if the request is received by the trial secretary **in writing**. A veterinarian's or doctor's note is required. Requests for refunds received after the commencement of the trial will not be given for any reason. No entry fees will be refunded if the Test cannot open or be completed by reason of riots, civil disturbances, fire, Act of God, public emergency, act of a public enemy, strike or any other cause beyond the control of the organizers.

RETURNED CHECKS DO NOT CONSTITUTE A VALID ENTRY. There will be a \$40.00 service charge for returned checks. Payment of entry fees and service charges shall be made in cash or money order within 30 days of postmark notice of returned check where notification is received after event date. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration number(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible, and all awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is canceled without recourse by owner/handler.

This event will be held indoors on dirt. There may be a food vendor on site.

Crating in designated areas only.

Dogs must remain with the handler on leash at all times, except when crated, competing in the ring or in the warm-up jump area. No dogs may be left unattended except when properly kenneled in designated kennel areas. Day kenneling only is permitted, unless otherwise posted at the show site. USDAA and JAG cannot and do not assume any liability for loss of any items left unattended.

Agility obstacles shall meet the requirements of USDAA Rules and Regulations. There will be no equipment familiarization at this event.

Dogs must be exercised only in designated areas. You are required to pick up after your dog at the site and at the hotels or you will be excused from the trial.

All Competitors, through entry at this event, waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.

Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, ALL COMPETITORS and HANDLERS HEREBY GRANT to USDAA and its representatives, agents, and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dog's name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known or hereafter to become known. All competitors and handlers hereby release USDAA and its representatives, agents, and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.

Only entries submitted on entry forms included in this test schedule will constitute a valid entry.

Additional information about the test site

No competitors allowed on Dream Park grounds prior to 6 AM. No competitors allowed in the restricted private horse boarding/polo barns area. Please read the posted signs.

All dogs must be on leash while on Dream Park property except when competing or in the designated warm up areas. Unleashed animals on Dream Park property will be subject to capture and/or fine and removal. Fine is \$50 per occurrence.

Loading and unloading ONLY in front of the main building entrance. Please do not leave your vehicle unattended in this area. **No parking in this area. Fire Marshals** require that no vehicle may be parked within **75 feet of any building, pavilion or in any roadway** in order for emergency vehicles to have access at all times. All vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. Vehicles not in compliance with parking rules will be subject to towing at the owner's expense.

Roller skates, skateboards, heelies and rollerblades are not permitted at DREAM PARK.

2010 DOG AGILITY MASTERS® TEAM DESCRIPTION

This tournament series is open to all competitors with any dog, regardless of competition level (i.e., starters, advanced and masters). A team may be comprised of handlers with dogs from any two height classes (e.g., 12"/26", 16"/26", 22"/22", etc). Each individual on a three-dog/three-handler team competes in four classes of competition— standard agility, snooker, jumpers and gamblers choice. Top teams as set forth herein compete in a fifth and final class –the three-dog team relay to establish placements for prizes and awards.

Each of the five classes will be conducted pursuant to USDAA Rules & Regulations, except that select performance requirements are subject to judge's discretion. The following differences are specifically noted:

- The performance requirements of the standard agility and relay classes as specified in Chapters 3 & 6 shall exclude the table (other than as a finish or relay exchange point) and may omit one contact obstacle in the course design at judge's discretion. When the table is used as a finish or relay exchange point, no position or time requirement shall be imposed.
- The performance requirements of the snooker, gamblers and jumpers classes shall generally follow the requirements of Chapter 6 of USDAA Rules & Regulations, except that:
 1. The jumpers class shall include weave poles and may omit one or more spread hurdles.
 2. The gamblers class may include or omit rules normally applied for point assignments, time allocations and joker requirements.
 3. The snooker class course configuration and course components may be at the judge's discretion. The foregoing variances are subject to the review and approval of the tournament course reviewer and other provisions set forth herein.

Scoring: Masters scoring rules shall apply for the determination of faults in all classes. Time-plus-faults scoring method shall be utilized in the standard, jumpers and team relay classes (i.e., no standard course time is employed), with the following special values assigned for infractions:

Each Refusal	2 fault points
Three refusals per dog or wrong course	1/3 of the Class Point Value.
Omission of a team member in relay (see special rules)	200 fault points

The resulting scores on a time-plus-faults basis shall be deducted from the standard point-basis for each class as set forth under "Special Rules" in order to calculate points earned by each team in a given class. In no case shall the team score for a single class be less than zero. These points shall be added to points earned in the gamblers and snooker classes, after adjustment as set forth*, to determine each team's final score. Team ranking and placements shall be on the basis of cumulative scores through the five classes of competition. 2010 PERFORMANCE VERSATILITY PAIRSSM DESCRIPTION

Description: This tournament series is open to all competitors with any dog, regardless of competition level (i.e., starters, advanced and masters). A Pair or "team" may be comprised of dogs from any two height classes (e.g., 8"/12, 16"/16", 8"/22", 16"/22", 22"/22", etc). Each individual on a team competes in four classes of competition – standard, snooker, jumpers and gamblers choice. Top teams as set forth herein compete in a fifth and final class – the pairs relay, to establish placements for prizes and awards. Each of the five classes will be conducted pursuant to USDAA Rules & Regulations, except that select performance requirements are subject to judge's discretion. The following differences are specifically noted:

- The performance requirements of the standard and relay classes as specified in Chapters 3 & 6 and modified by Chapter 7 shall exclude the table (other than as a finish or relay exchange point) and may omit one contact obstacle in the course design at judge's discretion. When the table is used as a finish or relay exchange point, no position or time requirement shall be imposed.
- The performance requirements of the snooker, gamblers and jumpers classes shall generally follow the requirements of Chapter 6 and modified by Chapter 7 of USDAA Rules & Regulations, except that:
 1. The jumpers class shall include the weave poles.
 2. The gamblers class may include or omit rules normally applied for point assignments, time allocations and joker requirements.
 3. The snooker class course configuration and course components may be at the judge's discretion.

Scoring: Masters scoring rules shall apply for the determination of faults in all classes. Time-plus-faults scoring method shall be utilized in the standard, jumpers and relay classes (i.e., no standard course time is employed), with the following special values assigned for infractions:

Each Refusal	2 fault points
Three refusals per dog or wrong course	1/2 of the Class Point Value.
Omission of a team member in relay (see special rules)	200 fault points

The resulting scores on a time-plus-faults basis shall be deducted from the standard point-basis for each class as set forth under "Special Rules" in order to calculate points earned by each pair in a given class. In no case shall the score for a single class be less than zero. These points shall be added to points earned in the gamblers and snooker classes, after adjustment as set forth below, to determine each pair's final score. Pair ranking and placements shall be on the basis of cumulative scores through the five classes of competition. Qualification for Team & Versatility Pairs: A qualifying score shall be awarded to competitors who compete in all five classes and whose team scores are within 25% of the average of the total points earned by the top three teams after the fifth and final class. In the event fewer than five (5) teams are entered, the minimum qualifying score will be calculated using the top score after all 5 classes. All competitors being entered on a team at the World Championships must be qualified through a local or regional qualifying event. Where a competitor has qualifying scores in both Championship and Performance Program tournaments, a competitor is eligible to enter the Performance Program tournaments at a regional, national, and/or world championship event only if the collective number of qualifications in the Performance Program tournaments for the season are greater in number than the number earned in Championship Program tournaments as of the closing date of the event to be entered.

Awards: Prizes and awards will be made based upon overall team scores after the five rounds. First through third place Team/pair members will receive "Gold", "Silver" & "Bronze" medals. Each member of a qualifying team/pairs (teams scoring within 25% of the average total points earned by the top three teams) will receive a lapel pin in recognition of their qualification.
